If you're like me, then your goals, needs and desires will seem pretty important to you. Whenever I read this verse, I am almost always struck by how definite it is. I am called to do NOTHING out of selfish desire, but to think of myself less as I think of others more. This is often a challenge as I feel the cares of life press in on me. However, I'm reminded then that it's God who takes care of me and calls me to live for Him and serve others.

So, if I am called to live outward, I need to keep my eyes off myself and focused on those around me.
