## Unit 1, Session 2

## **Questions for Discussion**

(Blue questions are geared toward kids ages 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade.)

- 1. What is sin? How did Adam and Eve sin? (SIN IS DISOBEYING GOD AND HIS COMMANDS. Every person sins because like Adam and Eve, we choose to do what we think is best and disobey what God says is best. Adam and Eve disobeyed God's command and chose to do what they thought was right. Sin causes brokenness in the world an din our relationships with others, including God.)
- 2. Why do you think our sin makes us want to hide from God like Adam and Eve? (Adam and Eve hid because they were afraid. When we recognize we are sinners, a natural response is fear of a holy God. Our sin reveals our guilt and it deserves to be punished. Through faith in Jesus, we are no longer guilty of sin and are brought back to God.)
- 3. What can we do when we sin? (When we sin, we don't need to hide like Adam and Eve or blame others for our sin. We can come to God and ask Him to forgive our sins. Jesus came to save us from sin by dying on the cross. Anyone can trust in Jesus, freely confess their sin to God, and be forgiven of sin.)
- 4. What does sin do to our relationships with people and with God? (Adam and Eve responded to being caught in sin by blaming others. They also tried to hide from God. Sin creates brokenness in relationships. Sin separates us from God. Read Romans 3:23.)
- 5. What is the ultimate consequence of sin? (God said that disobeying His command would lead to death. Sin leads to a physical and spiritual death because sin separates us from God. Read Romans 5:12.)
- 6. Why is God's promise to send a descendant from Eve to destroy the snake good news? (This promise points to God's Son Jesus, who would enter the world and live a perfect life. Jesus gave Himself as a sacrifice on the cross for our sins and defeated death. Faith in Jesus gives us forgiveness of sins and eternal life. Read Romans 6:23.)
