## Unit 6, Session 4

## **Questions for Discussion**

(Blue questions are geared toward kids ages 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade.)

- 1. Will God ever leave His people? Why not? (God has promised to be with His people forever. God's people are those who have placed their faith in Jesus for the forgiveness of their sins. God is trustworthy and His promises never fail.)
- 2. Why do you think Moses said the people would keep disobeying God? (God spoke to Moses and told Moses that the people would disobey. God knows all things, and He knows that all people are sinful. God knew His people would need to repent, or turn away from their sin, and turn back to Him. God made the way for people to be able to obey His commands through faith in Jesus.)
- 3. How is Jesus a better leader than Moses? (Moses was a sinner and was not even able to enter the Promised Land. Jesus never sinned and only He can lead us to forgiveness, life, and into the kingdom of God. Follow Jesus and trust that He will always lead us to what is best.)
- 4. Would it have been hard for you to see the Promised Land and not be able to go in? Why? (God doesn't promise we will see every good promise fulfilled into our lifetime. If we have trusted in Jesus, then we will experience all the joys of heaven forever. Read Deuteronomy 31:18.)
- 5. Before he died, Moses warned the people to obey God. Why do you think he gave this warning? Look at Deuteronomy 31:18? (God knew they would turn away from Him and turn to other false gods. Moses warned the people to obey God because they were prone to disobey God. Moses was trying to help the Israelites see their temptations to turn away from God and instead turn back to God. Read Deuteronomy 31:20-22.)
- 6. Why it Jesus the perfect, faithful leader and greater than Motes? (Moses was a sinner and was not even able to enter the Promised Land. Jesus never sinned, and only He can lead us to forgiveness, life, and into the kingdom of God. Follow Jesus and trust that He will always lead us to what is best. Read John 5:46.)
